The Marine Corps Community Services (MCCS) organization at the Marine Corps base in Twentynine Palms, California is interested in contracting for a nationally or regionally recognized multiple branded, fast-food, Food Court Operations aboard the base, formally known as the Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center (MCAGCC) or "the Combat Center" for short. You are being sent this Letter of Interest to determine your level of interest in participating in the competition for providing these services.

We are looking for a business partner for nationally or regionally recognized multiple branded, fast-food, Food Court services with a base term of five (5) years with ten (10) one-year extensions.

So who is MCCS Twentynine Palms? Marine Corps Community Services was established in 1999 and remains the only organization within the Department of Defense that combines Family Services; Off-Duty Voluntary Education; Children, Youth and Teen Programs; Morale, Welfare and Recreation; and Marine Corps Exchanges under a single organizational construct.


Our sole mission is to enhance the "Quality of Life" for our Marines, Sailors, Retirees & their families. MCCS provides a diverse variety of educational and support services plus Retail Activities; Restaurant and Lounge Facilities; Health, Fitness, and Recreational outlets; and other service activities. We currently have concessionaire contracts with nationally known vendors such as Carl's Jr., Taco Bell, Charley's Grilled Subs, Game Stop, GNC, Extreme Pita, Di Carlo's Italian Café, Enterprise Rent-a-Car, Domino's Pizza, Church's Fried Chicken, and Sprint to name a few.

About our location, the Combat Center is located in the sunny high-desert of southern California about an hours drive from Palm Springs and adjacent to Joshua Tree National Park. The City of Twentynine Palms is the nearest community, which is six miles from the Main Exchange building. The economic impact of the base to the local economy, just in terms of salaries, is in excess of \$412,000,000. Add to that the pensions of local military retirees and the total exceeds \$465,000,000. Our base population is roughly 28,781 daily, consisting of uniformed military, family members, civilian employees, local military retirees and contractors doing business aboard the Combat Center. In addition to the previous, the Combat Center
